The course examines the main issues related to the development of the syntactic component by L1 learners. We will discuss the core principles, the models and the methodology that have been suggested by the linguistics trends. The main objective of the course is to understand and be able to evaluate children's comprehension and production with respect to the following issues:

- a) Acquisition of argument structure
- b) Acquisition of verbal morpho-syntax
- c) Acquisition of Case
- d) Acquisition of word order and development of the complements of the verb

- e) Development of questions
- f) Acquisition of chains
- g) Acquisition of passive constructions
- h) Acquisition of Unaccusatives
- i) Acquisition of Prepositions
- j) Acquisition of Clitics.
