The aim of this course is to acquaint students with the basic historical, ideological and artistic issues pertaining to the works of Athenian Romanticism (1830-1880). Upon completing this course, students will be able to:

- describe and discuss the socio-historical context of Athenian Romanticism
- discuss the reception of the romantic movement within the ideological framework of the newly founded Greek state
- describe the state of the language question in the period 1830-1880
- discuss the role of institutions and social practices (such as poetry competitions and family magazines) in shaping the aesthetic canon, literary evolution and the linguistic choices of the authors
- designate the major characteristics and enumerate the major authors and works of the period
- describe the evolution of Athenian Romanticism within the period 1830-1880;
- describe and discuss the major tendencies in poetry, the novel, and the short story of the

period

- analyze representative works of poetry and fiction.
