2. LEARNING OUTCOMES

Learning outcomes

The overall objective of the course is to familiarize students with the history of the Modern Greek theater in the 20th century and to get to know the conditions, events and persons that shaped its contemporary character. The course will focus on the main stages of the evolution of the pre-war, inter-war and post-war Greek theater, not just at the level of events (founding of Royal, later National Theater of Greece, the emergence of the Greek Theatre Revue and Operetta, the establishment of the Epidaurus Festival, the new generation of Greek theatrical writers dedicated to realism), as well as key developments at the level of structures (emergence of the director's profession) the effort to control theater through acting and licensing, statism and free theater, grants and theatrical hydrocephalism, tradition and Greekness. Upon successful completion of the course students will be able to:

- Understand the key and critical features of 20th century modern Greek theater
- distinguish the basic aesthetic and ideological currents as they appear in theater in Greece during the 20th century
- Recognize key stations in the history of 20th century theater and, in particular, its heritage in contemporary theater.

- 2. Theater building: National (Royal) Theatre of Greece, State of Thessaloniki, Greek National Opera, Arma Thespidos, Kotopouli Semi-state troupe. License as an enforcement and control institution. Commercial theatre companies. The eviction of the theatrical demon and the folk element from the scenes.
- 3 Occupation: The recruitment of the Revue. V. Rotas Theater Studio (1942-1944). The founding of the Art Theater (1942). The National Theater: Pelos Katselis, Socrates Karantinos, Takis Mouzenidis.
