2. LEARNING OUTCOMES LEARNING OUTCOMES

Thorough study of epic and tragic representations of the mythical hero Achilles in the poetry of Archaic and Classical times.

Independent bibliographical research, familiarization with online databases (*TLG*, *APh*, *ThesCRA*, *LIMC*, etc). The seminar requires an oral presentation, participation in class discussions and a written essay.

Students are expected

- (a) To familiarize themselves with ancient Greek epic and tragic poetry especially as regards the handling of heroic myth.
- (b) To aquaint themselves with electronic and other bibliographical databases, in order to find

and use basic bibliography.

- (c) To argue their positions eloquently and to answer questions effectively in the course of their oral presentation
- (d) To compose a written essay in Greek (or English for Erasmus students)

3. COURSE DESCRIPTION

The seminar will focus on epic and tragic representations of the mythical hero Achilles (Achilles in the *Iliad*; Achilles in the lost epics; Achilles in lost tragedies; Achilles in extant tragedies).

An introduction to the general subject of study will be provided by the tutor; methodological issues will also be analyzed and topics of papers assigned. Participants will be expected:

To study thoroughly the particular topic chosen for investigation

To find and study the relevant bibliography

To present their topic orally and answer questions

To write an academic paper on the topic .
