<b>LEARNING OUTCOMES</b>
<p>The main objective of this course is to familiarize the students with the literary genre of historiography during the Augustan Era and more specifically with the work of Dionysius of Halicarnassus, <i>Roman Antiquities</i>. Upon completion of the course the students are expected to be able to:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- know basic facts regarding the life and works of the writer,</li> <li>- translate excerpts from <i>Roman Antiquities</i>,</li> <li>- interpret passages from <i>Roman Antiquities</i> by taking into account the political, social and cultural context (milieu or discourses) of that era,</li> <li>- comment upon the influences of Augustan ideology on the writing style of Dionysius.</li> </ul>
