## LEARNING OUTCOMES

This course emphasizes the relationship between Cinema and the Press. All types of Press are analyzed, with particular emphasis on the specialized cinema Press. This course provides students with a fundamental understanding of the relationship between the Press and Cinema, as well as the factors that influence how the Press perceives cinematic products, reflecting the sociopolitical reality. Additionally, it analyzes all the information the Press can provide about film production more broadly, with a focus on advertising, film posters, and the box office.

Specifically, upon completion of the course, students will be able to:

Understand the connection between cinema and the Press Distinguish between different types of Press and the specific evaluation criteria that govern them Analyze the role of politics in the reception and promotion of cinema through the Press Identify trends in film criticism that have influenced Greek film critics Recognize the function of film criticism as a tool for social and political shaping
