The aim of the course is to delve into the Modern Greek prose of the period 1880-1900. Upon completing this course, students will be able to:

- -understand the factors that led to the realist turn in Modern Greek literature around 1880 as well as the significance of this change
- -form a general picture of prose writing in the last two decades of the century
- -be familiar with the aesthetic currents of realism and naturalism and to recognize the basic conventions of realist and naturalistic narrative
- -discuss the term " $\eta\theta$ ογραφία" and its manifestations (rural and urban $\eta\theta$ ογραφία)
- -to discuss representative texts of the most important writers of the 1880s generation
- -become familiar with the style and technique of important writers of the time
- -relate literary texts to the ideological context of the time
- -recognize basic narrative techniques in the analysis of texts
