The general aim of the course is to familiarize students with Modern Greek literature that depicts aspects of the Holocaust. More specifically, after the completion of the course, students should be able to:

- Know the most representative Modern Greek short stories and novels written about the Holocaust.
- Analyze the topics of the Holocaust in literature (persecution of Jews, deportation, camp experience, life of survivors, etc.)
- Indentify and describe the narrative techniques that authors have used to write about the Holocaust.
- Relate the texts under examination with the process that led to the formation of Holocaust memory in Greece.
- Write a scientific essay.

STUDENT ASSESSMENT

Oral presentation (20%) and essay (60%). In the final assessment, the level of participation in seminar discussion will also be considered (20%).
