2. LEARNING OUTCOMES

LEARNING OUTCOMES

The aim of the seminar is to assimilate the students with the procedure of publishing a theatre play, specifically a theatre revue nuber, as a serious possibility to use it as a professional resource exists. During the course the students will be confronted with the usual publishing problems of a play, such as the particularity of the form, the fluidity of the text, the linguistic form of the old texts with the dilemma of its preservation or adaptation. We will also be concerned about the ideal introduction to a printed play and what components and parts it should consist of. The students will experiment with anecdotal theatre play manuscripts that are in the possession of the Division of Theater, Film and Music Studies through the acquisition of records of personalities of the modern Greek theatre - mainly of the writer's archive, Dimitris Giannoukakis - and will proceed to a virtual (why not real?) publication.
